Sheet-Feed Scanner

Scan loose pages (front and back) to PDF or image file, up to 112 sheets per minute, up to 118.1 inches long in one pass. Use pre-set jobs and press the green button, or create jobs to your preferences. Save to USB flash drive, CD, or print.

OpticBook

The OpticBook Scanner scans to the gutter without shadow, is simple to use, scans in 2.1 seconds at highest speed, creates PDF, JPG, TIFF files and more. Scan color, grayscale, or text at up to 600 dpi, or custom resolution.



Photo-slide Scanners

While all of our scanners will scan images, the Epson Perfection V750, and Expression 10000 professional scanners excel in scanning slides (diapositives) and negatives. Instruction is available. Scanning transparencies, slides and negatives requires patience and attention to detail. Patrons have scanned thousands of images on these scanners. Scan Pro Microform Reader/Scanner

Tired of looking at film and fiche the old fashioned way? Improve research with digital scanning -- view real time on 24 or 30 inch computer monitors, spot edit poor images, adjust brightness, contrast, and skew. View 16mm or 35mm film, microfiche, or micro-opaque on one machine. Auto scan multiple images or entire film. High resolution scan to flash drive in all popular formats, or send to printer in seconds. Email images to anyone. Auto rewind, no manual rewinding anymore.
