

Title: Oral History and Women's History Ambassador

Description: Working with the Community Engagement Coordinator, the Women's History Initiative, and the public history team at the Utah Historical Society, this ambassador will work to preserve and share underrepresented voices in Utah history through the oral history program and other means. This Ambassadorship will help add more sources, voices, and perspectives to the Utah Historical Society's collections, resources, and programming.

This Ambassador will help manage the Utah Historical Society oral history program, as part of the Peoples of Utah Revisited initiative. They will coordinate and conduct oral history interviews at Scan-and-Share events, research and interview important Utahns who are not part of an oral history project, and manage all transcription work that comes from these interviews.

Building on their research and community work with oral history interviews, the Ambassador will also work with internal and external partners to develop resources and programming that draw on the oral history program to engage Utahns with the history they are preserving.

Key Responsibilities:



- Research Utahns to interview to add the voices of women and underrepresented groups to the Utah Historical Society collections. Create lists of topics and questions for each interview.
- Schedule and conduct oral history interviews.
- Transcribe and edit oral history interviews conducted individually and at Scan-and-Share events using Otter.a.i.
- Manage the oral history section at Scan-and-Share events
- Conduct historical research in newspapers, archives, and collections across Utah, with special attention to representation of women and underrepresented groups in our history.
- Based on the Ambassador's research and oral history interviews, work with the
 UHS public history team and external partners to develop engaging resources and
 programming that shares the stories of women and underrepresented groups. The
 form of these projects will be guided by community partners' needs and the
 Ambassador's interests and could include a virtual tour, walking tour, local history
 scavenger hunt, storymap, etc.

Time Commitment: 10-12 hours per week, flexible per the Ambassador's needs and schedule for up to one year
