


FAST FACTS

- Safely houses, preserves, and protects state's history and art collection


MUSEUM LAYOUT



BECOMING UTAH

Explores the people who have always been here and their perspectives, Utah's unique history of statehood, and the push-pull factors that have brought people to Utah over time.

A HOME FOR THE STATE'S COLLECTION

The Museum of Utah will include state-of-the-art storage facilities to house the state's entire history and art collection, including Utah Historical Society's collection of historical objects and artworks and the State of Utah Alice Merrill Horne Art Collection. Bringing these collections together for the first time into one space will allow our professional collections team to more safely preserve and protect our state's historical objects for future generations.









HIGHLIGHTS

LOBBY

This open and bright thoroughfare will serve as a welcoming space for all Capitol complex visitors, providing wayfinding and orientation.

CHANGING GALLERY

This gallery will be dedicated for rotating exhibitions, providing an opportunity to expand public access to the state's collections.

UTAH CREATES

This area explores the impact of the arts in Utah. Visitors are encouraged to seek out art in everyday life, reflect on who they share art with, and the opportunities art provides economically and socially.

MORMON METEOR III

A focal point of the "Inspiring Utah" gallery, visitors will encounter this dynamic display conveying the vehicle's speed and endurance records along with the history of Ab Jenkins and the salt flats.

FROM TIME IMMEMORIAL


Located within the "Becoming Utah" gallery, this exhibition, developed in partnership with Utah's tribal nations, includes a theater for deeper storytelling and installations about Indigenous Sovereignty.

LEARNING SPACES

With an Engagement Room, Smart Classroom, and Multi-Use Education Space, the Museum welcomes researchers, school groups, and others who want to schedule hands-on learning experiences.





THEATERS

Immersive theaters give visitors the opportunity to immerse themselves into Utah's history and culture.

CELEBRATIONS THEATER Includes tactile objects, interactives, touchscreens and videos that are centered around Utah's unique cultural celebrations.

UTAH INSPIRES THEATER Features a four-to-six-minute film blending sweeping landscapes, aerial views of iconic places, and individual voices speaking to what it means to be a Utahn.

BUILDING UTAH THEATER

Features a five-screen film based on worker's oral histories, while relevant artifacts are illuminated.


TRIBAL THEATER
