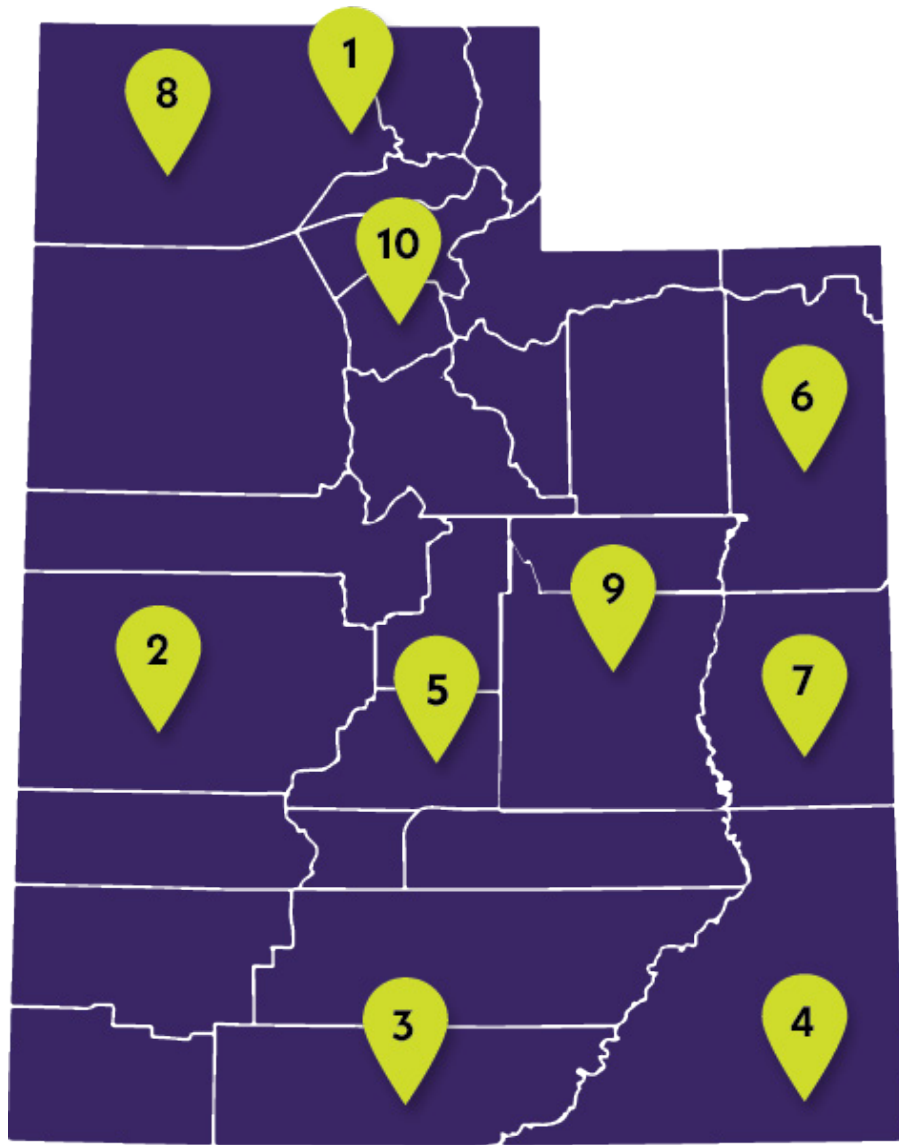

# Utah Civic Season Road Trip Stops

**1. Brigham City Museum of Art & History | 24 N. 300 West, Brigham City**

Explore historical exhibitions that help illuminate the history of Utah and our state's place in the world. Admission to the museum and its events is free.

**2. Topaz Museum | 55 W. Main St., Delta**

Learn about the Topaz site and its World War II history. Admission to the museum is by donation.

**3. Kanab Museum | 13 N. 100 East, Kanab**

Experience thousands of artifacts and archives that educate and engage the public about Kanab's rich history. Admission to the museum's permanent exhibits is free.

**4. Edge of the Cedars State Park Museum | 660 W. 400 North, Blanding**

View the largest collection of Ancestral Puebloan (Anasazi) pottery on display in the Four Corners Region and explore an authentic Puebloan village behind the museum. Admission rates may vary.

**5. Fremont Indian State Park and Museum | 3820 Clear Creek Canyon Rd., Sevier**

Discover artifacts, petroglyphs, and pictographs left by the Fremont Indians. This museum preserves treasures from the site, including pottery, baskets, and arrowheads. Admission rates may vary.

**6. Uintah County Heritage Museum | 155 East Main St., Vernal**

Explore several main attractions, including the First Lady Dolls Exhibit, which features some of the most unique, hand-crafted dolls. Admission to the museum is free.

**7. Utahraptor State Park | BLM 142, Moab**

Visit the new Utahraptor State Park, which includes popular recreation spots such as the Dalton Wells and Willow Springs areas. Explore the park and learn the rich history of the site. Admission rates may vary.

**8. Golden Spike National Historical Park | 6200 N. 22300 West, Corinne**

See the location of the Last Spike Site, 1869 railroad construction features, walk or drive on the original railroad grade, and get an up close view of Victorian era replica locomotives. Admission rates may vary.

**9. Buckhorn Wash Pictograph Panel | Buckhorn Draw Rd., Green River**

Enjoy viewing one of the most spectacular examples of Barrier Canyon style rock art. The site includes both painted (Pictographs) and pecked (Petroglyph) prehistoric images.

**10. Fort Douglas Military Museum | 32 Potter St., Salt Lake City**

Explore what was originally a 19th century barracks, including various exhibits on the history of Utah and adjacent western states. Admission to the museum is free.
